The opening balance for all accounts for April 2019 was \$5,177.01 from \$4,893.36 in checking, \$183.65 in PayPal, and

\$100.00 in petty cash. Expenses for the month in checking were \$9.00 for hospitality, \$17.55 for the newsletter, \$14.19 in credit card service charges (from plant sales at the Iris Show), \$536.00 in member bonuses from the plant sale, \$200.00 remuneration for the Iris Show judges, \$16.00 lunch for the judges, \$186.97 for Show supplies, and \$6.50 for postage and shipping totaling \$1,007.08. Checking income was \$1,244.00 from \$172.00 in plant marker sales and \$1072.00 in plant sales at the Iris Show. PayPal expenses were \$35.00 for AIS membership for Ricky and Vicki Howard and \$25.00 for ADS membership for Sharon Smith totaling \$60.00. There was no activity in petty cash. Ending balances were \$5,130.28 in checking, \$123.65 in PayPal, and \$100.00 in petty cash for a total of \$5,353.93.

The 29th annual show also included an Artistic Design Division, Photography Division and water color paintings of Irises by Ann Winchester's Friday evening art Class.

Iris Show Winners Announced by Peggy Cathey

Visitors to the Johnson County Iris and Daylily Society's 29th Annual American Iris Society accredited Iris Show were treated to a rainbow of colors. The show was held April 20, 2019, at the J. N. Long Cultural Arts Complex in Cleburne. The show included over 100 different varieties of irises, creative artistic designs, colorful photographs and a beautiful display of irises painted in watercolor.

Dan and Peggy Cathey of Covington were the big winners in In the Horticulture Division. Iris **'Splatter Matters'** (J. Painter, 2010) took top honors winning **Queen of Show, Best Novelty Iris** by having both a broken color pattern (dark velvety purple with white streaks) and an unusual form by having 4 standards (upright petals) and 4 falls (downward sepals) instead of the usual 3 and 3. It also won the

award for **Best Purple**. The Catheys received the Bronze Medal for second most blue ribbons (14).

In the Artistic Design Division, the show theme, chosen by Show Chair, Karen Singletary, was **The Irises of Texas**. Peggy Cathey received Best of Show with her winning design **The Fort Worth Rodeo** in the North Central Texas Division. Peggy also won the Artistic Design Sweepstakes by winning 3 of the 4 division classes.

The top winner of the Photography Division was Peggy Cathey with her Single Iris entry "Grain Exchange."

Mary Keeth of Alvarado was the second most winner receiving the Silver Medal Horticulture Sweepstakes for having the most blue ribbons (15). Her entry, I. **'Huckleberry Sundae'**, was the 1st runner-up of the show.

In the Youth Division, Isabella

Velasquez of Joshua won **Queen of Show** with her entry, I. **'Jesse's Song'**.

AIS Regional Vice President, Peggy Cathey, stated the Cleburne show is the largest in the state, so far, having 134 horticulture entries. AIS Region 17 includes all of Texas and has 15 affiliate societies around the state.

Johnson County Iris and Daylily Society will be co-hosting a Daylily Show, June 8, 2019, with the Daylily Growers of Dallas. The show will be held at the J.N. Long Cultural Arts Complex and will open to the public from 1-4 p.m.

Johnson County Iris and Daylily Society meetings are held the 2nd Saturday of each month at 10:00 a.m. in the community room of the United Cooperative Services, 3309 N. Main in Cleburne. Visitors are always welcome.
